Pat Harrison's Easy Peasy Circles Quilt View Arts ~ October 18, 2023 Supply List

1. A 1200" (30 - $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strip) or 1600" (40 - $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strip) jelly roll sewn into a quilt top using mitered or butted joins with seams pressed open. **This needs to be completed before you come to the class.**

Do not add borders to your jelly roll quilt top.

- 2. Scrap fabrics for practice circle: two squares 10" square, 8" square
- 3. Fabrics for circle insets: about 10-15 ranging in size from 8" to 3" squares for gradiating circles as in sample. You may consider gradiating the colors of your inset circle fabrics.
- 4. Freezer Paper
- 5. Olfa™ or similar Circle Cutter if you have one, or a compass.
- 6. Elmer's™ White School Glue (no substitutes, please)
- 7. Iron Rowenta™ travel or Continental™ Platinum dry it must be able to get very hot to heat set!
- 8. Hard surface pressing board
- 9. Your usual Sewing Supplies, including paper scissors and fine point embroidery scissors (like Gingher TM Model #4014)
- 10. Sewing machine in good working order (machine manual if you use this machine infrequently)
- 11. Coordinating sewing thread
- 12. Heavy Duty or Regular Spray Starch with cap (to use as a starch reservoir)
- 13. Small paint brush for starch
- 14. Mechanical pencil with black lead and/or Bohin™ white chalk pencil.
- 15. \$10 for pattern (optional)
